- Academics (Korea University through TEAN):

  -I was really excited to take the one fashion class that I did get to take because they didn't offer too many art classes to international students. The teachers were all pretty friendly, especially the language teachers. The most difficult part was that they prioritized assessments, like tests, over assignments, so if you're someone who needs more practice, you had to do that on your own.
- Seoul as a Second Home:

- Piece of Advice:
