9 things to know about Title IX

Title IX prohibits discrimination in education programs that receive federal funding.

Sexual harassment and assault are types of discrimination Title IX bans.

Title IX applies to all genders, students, faculty, and staff.

Mount Mary has established procedures for handling complaints of gender discrimination & sexual assault.

MMU must take immediate action to ensure complainants continue their education free of ongoing harassment.

Mount Mary may not retaliate against someone filing a complaint & must keep complainants safe from retaliation.

MMU can issue "no contact" directives to prevent accused abusers from interacting with victims.

Sexual harassment and assault create a hostile environment that interferes with students' abilities to benefit from educational programs.


