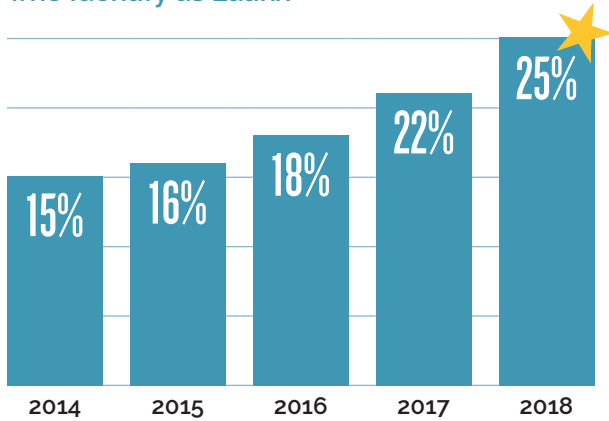

FINANCIAL AID & ACADEMIC SUPPORT

47% OF GRACE SCHOLARS ARE LATINX

Mount Mary's **Grace Scholars Program**, covers 85 percent of tuition for four years for incoming freshmen from the city of Milwaukee and West Milwaukee who demonstrate leadership skills and have financial need. The program provides young women leaders with academic, personal, and financial support. Each year 30 students are selected to be part of the program. The Grace Scholars Program is generously supported by the Burke Foundation, We Energies Foundation, Ralph Evinrude Foundation, U.S. Bank, and Mount Mary University.

46% OF LATINX STUDENTS ARE FIRST GENERATION

In addition, 78% are Pell eligible.

41% OF PROMISE PROGRAM STUDENTS ARE LATINX

Mount Mary University's **Promise Program** is a federally funded program that provides academic, career and financial support to 140 first-generation and limited-income college students each year. The program supports students to remain in good academic standing, persist in college and graduate with a bachelor's degree.

In Fall 2018, **20%** of Mount Mary Latinx students lived in the residence halls on campus.

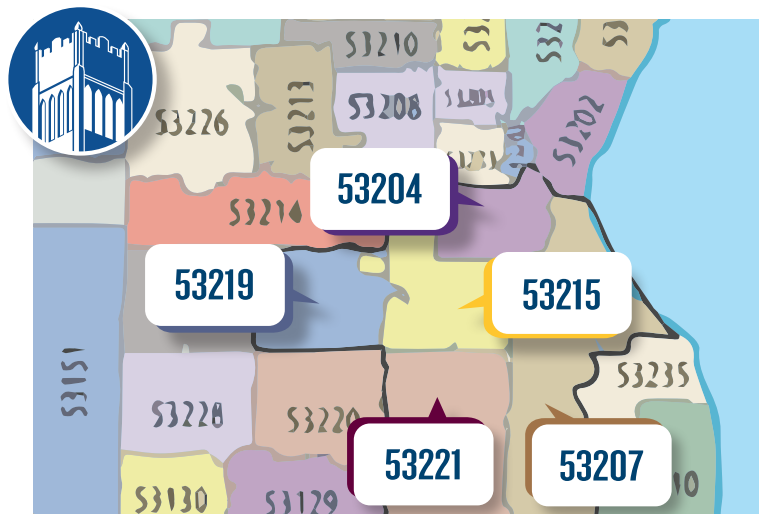
Athletic Participation
