Mount Mary's RN to BSN is designed for working RNs who wish to complete their bachelor's degree in nursing and is open to both women and men for enrollment.

Courses are offered in an online, accelerated, 8-week format, allowing for completion of the program in as little as 18 months. The final capstone experience involves working with a partner agency on an approved project in the health care environment; this does involve in person participation.

EMPLOYMENT OUTLOOK

The nursing workforce continues to experience a shortage of nurses. Professional organizations continue to push for the BSN as entry level into the profession as the expectations for practice continue to increase. According to the US Bureau of Labor Statistics (September 6, 2023), there will be job opening for 193,00 nurses per year through 2032 or an annual growth rate of 3% (Bureau of Labor Statistics, September 6, 2023). Today 51.%% of nurses enter the workforce with a bachelor of science in nursing (BSN) with the total workforce of BSN grads standing at 71.7% of the workforce (AACN Fact Sheet, October 2023).
